How do I get to Grand Canyon West?

See all the Southwest has to offer including Hoover Dam and largest Joshua Tree forest in the U.S. by driving your own vehicle to Grand Canyon West. There is a 9 mile stretch of graded and maintained yet unpaved road leading to Grand Canyon West, less than 3 hours from Las Vegas, is located in a remote part of the Grand Canyon and cell phone reception is scarce so be sure to **plan ahead and check our website www.grandcanyonwest.com** for directions. Tour options are available from Las Vegas, Sedona, and Phoenix by airplane, helicopter, motorcoach, Hummer and SUV.



Grand Canyon West is privately owned and operated by the Hualapai Tribe and requires the purchase of a permit and tour package for entry. Upon arrival, private vehicles are parked and visitors join the Hop-On-Hop-Off shuttle included in the tour.

Viewpoints

All Grand Canyon West tour packages include a convenient Hop-On-Hop-Off shuttle system that continuously operates, giving you the freedom to create your own experience. You choose the sights to see and how much time you would like to spend at each one.

Eagle Point

- Grand Canyon Skywalk:** the glass bridge 4,000 feet (1,200 meters) above the Grand Canyon floor.
- Native American Village:** walking tour of authentic Native American dwellings depicting multiple tribes.
- Amphitheater:** live Native American performances from multiple tribes demonstrated continuously all day.
- Creations by Native Hands:** featuring handmade, authentic Native American jewelry and crafts.

Guano Point

- "Highpoint Hike":** offering breathtaking panoramic canyon views of the Grand Canyon and Colorado River.
- Visit the remnants of a **historic tram** that stretched 8,800 feet across the canyon to a guano mine discovered in the 1930's.
- Dine** right on the edge of the Grand Canyon with uninhibited 360 degree canyon views.
- Hualapai Market:** interact with Tribal members offering Native American jewelry and crafts.

Hualapai Ranch

- Enjoy **western hospitality, cowboy entertainment, wagon rides**, and more.
- Learn how to rope**, quick draw, and tomahawk toss the cowboy way.
- Horseback riding:** guided 30 minute, 90 minute, and 3 hour rides to and along the canyon rim.
- Stay overnight** in western **cabins** facing the canyon rim. Join the cowboys making **S'mores** and telling **stories** around an open fire.
