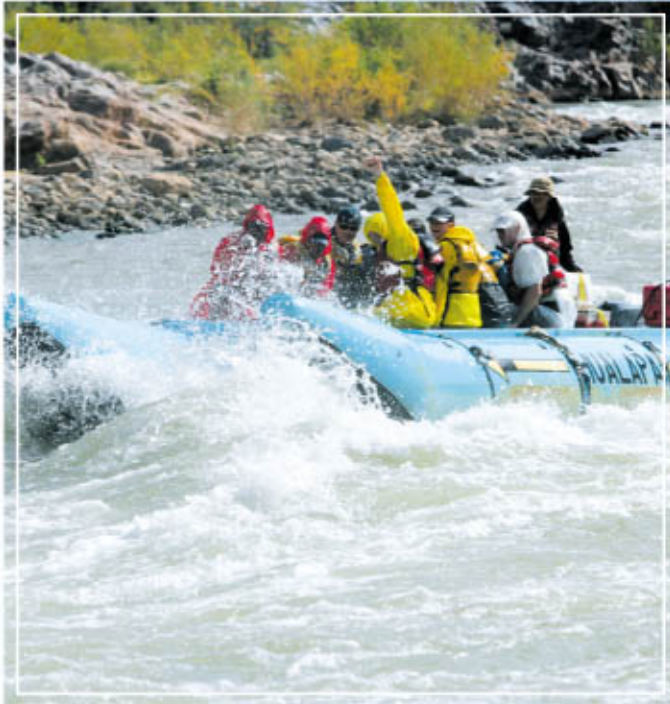

Rafting, Hiking and Exploring in the Grand Canyon

Begin early in the morning with a ride to Diamond Creek to begin your whitewater tour. At the shore of the Colorado River, your raft will be waiting and soon you will encounter your first set of rapids... a taste of what lies downstream.

Pull over on the south side of the canyon to begin a moderate hike to Travertine Falls. Return to the river where the water disappears from the horizon below the towering canyon walls, dropping into a Caldera, a boulder-choked chute of solid whitewater!

Tour Includes:

- Snacks, beverages and lunch (vegetarian meals available)
- Dry storage container

*O*ur guides are qualified with hundreds of miles of river experience. Our motorized rafts are built with a 15'x7' foot aluminum frame and can hold up to eight passengers to accommodate groups and large families. Each boat has a storage area for bags and belongings and a First-Aid kit.

Personal Gear & Packing List

We highly recommend the following personal gear:

- waterproof shorts (lightweight, fast-drying material)
- rain jacket/poncho for use through rapids
- towel
- tennis/athletic shoes or river-type sandals
- bandanna
- lightweight jacket/polar fleece sweatshirt
- t-shirt
- lightweight pants for sun protection
- swimsuit (optional)
- hat with retention strap or visor
- sunglasses with strap
- small bag for belongings
- sun block
- camera*

***Cameras** - all cameras should have straps. We suggest keeping your camera in a zip-lock bag, even when it is in your dry storage container.

***Video cameras** - there is no place to recharge batteries. Video cameras will not fit in the dry storage container, therefore we suggest bringing a waterproof bag.

***Cell Phones** - please be advised there is no cell phone service at Peach Springs.

***Rapids** - on the Colorado River, rapids are rated on a scale of 1-10, not 1-5, similar to the rest of the United States. The Colorado rapids are rated 3-7.

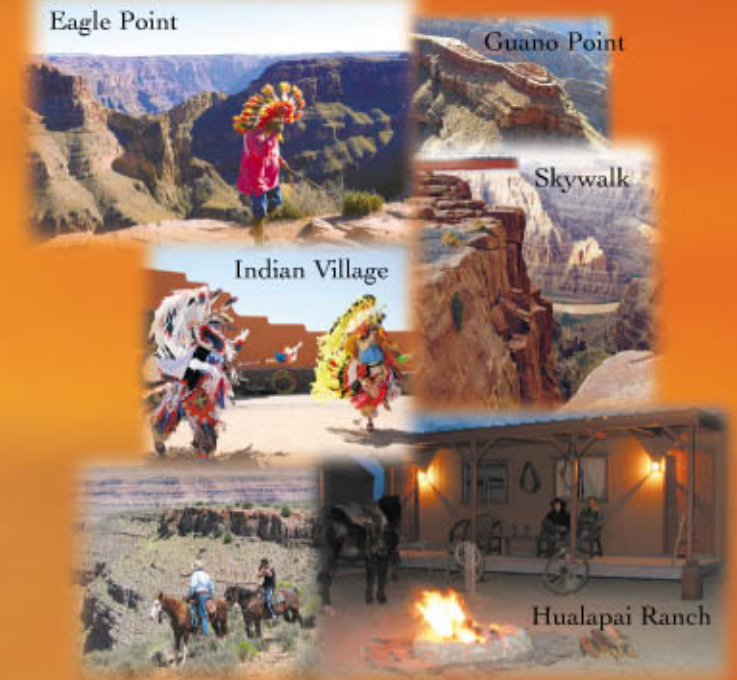

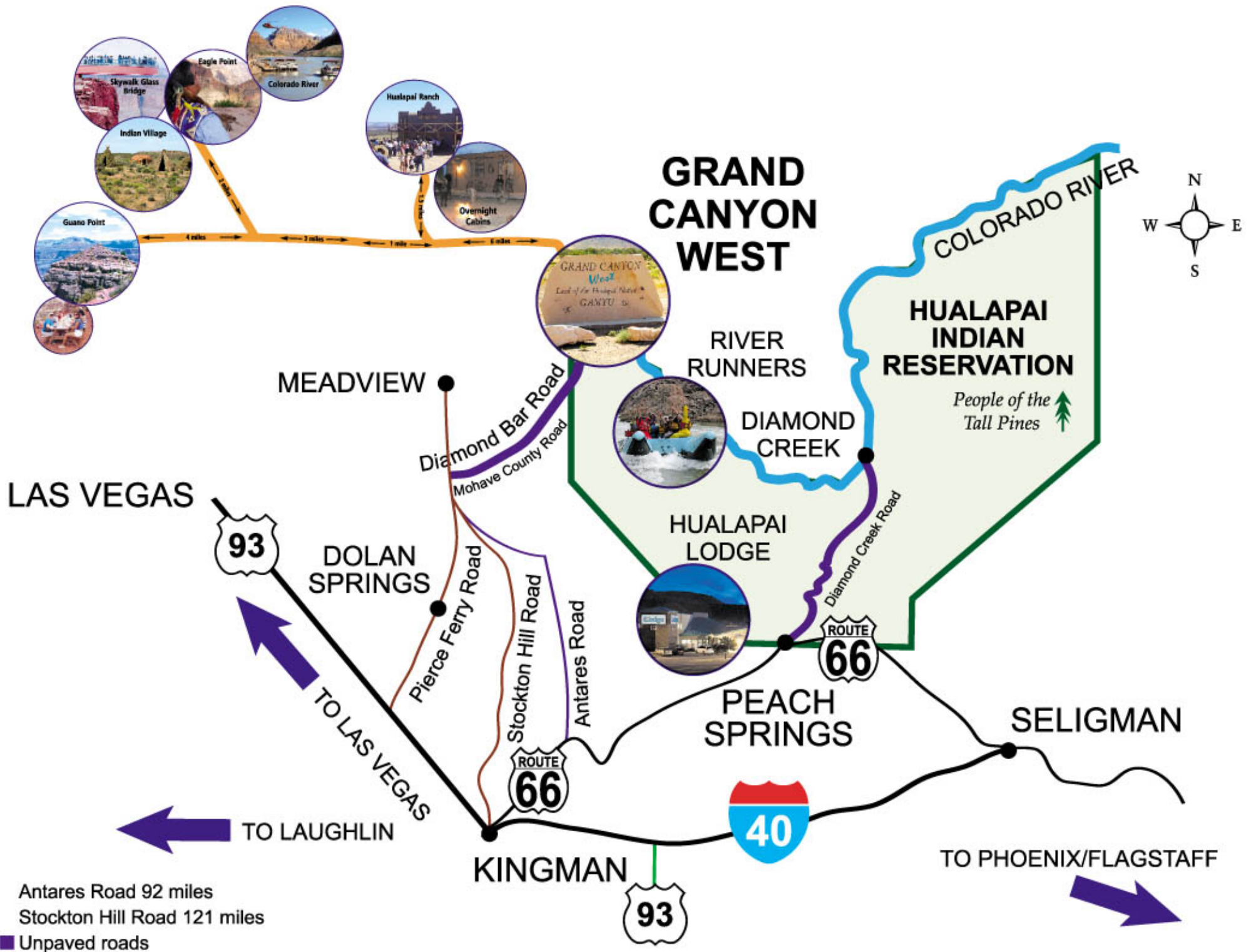
